



2015 Annual Relationship, Marriage, and Divorce Survey Preliminary Findings



The Study

These are findings from an Ipsos poll conducted May 11-15, 2015.

For the survey, a sample of 2,011 U.S. adults age 18 and over was interviewed online. The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus 2.5 percentage points for all respondents.

The data were weighted to the U.S. current population data by gender, age, region, and household income based on Census data.



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


Relationship Satisfaction and Related Attitudes



Love is in the air


Americans report being satisfied in their relationships. Men and women are equally satisfied.






People believe in relationships

Most Americans reject the notion that relationships aren't meant to last.








Love can even withstand the prenup

Though **only 2% of Americans have prenuptial agreements**, most say that a partner offering one up wouldn't call their romantic feelings into question.




...say that if their partner asked for a prenup, they would doubt their feelings for them.



More Midwesterners believe in longevity


More people living in the Midwest believe that relationships were meant to last.





More women than men believe relationships were meant to last

Despite that the same % of men and women are satisfied, more women believe that relationships are meant to last. Marriage may make men more likely to believe in longevity.





- Marriage is not an outdated institution



More men are likely to see marriage as a life goal, even though more men than women also see it as an outdated institution.




...say marriage is not a goal in life.

More men than women are likely to believe that a legal document isn't a sign of true love.




...say they don't need a legal document to prove they love their partner.

Most Americans – and more women than men – choose personal fulfillment over being coupled up.




Attitudes And Behaviors Around Faithfulness

Despite high rates of relationship satisfaction, about half of all Americans might be open to having an open relationship.




Please indicate the extent to which you agree or disagree with each of these statements: If my partner wanted an open relationship, I would leave him/her. n for all=2011.

Even more say they have no problem with open relationships morally.




Please indicate the extent to which you agree or disagree with each of these statements: I am morally opposed to the idea of open relationships. n for all=2011.

...say that if their partner wanted an open relationship, they'd leave him/her.



...say they're morally opposed to the idea of open relationships.



Men might also be more likely to date someone who is married

More men than women might be comfortable on the outside of an open relationship, dating someone who is married.

More Northeasterners would date a married person

More so than people in other regions, people in the Northeast don't reject the idea of having a relationship with a married person.







West Coasters may be more open to open relationships

Fewer people living in the Midwest report having every cheated on their partners.



But actions don't match attitudes

The proportion of open relationships in the U.S. is very low.




...say they've had or are having an open relationship

More men than women have cheated on their partner.




...say they have cheated or are currently cheating.



Cheating may happen less in the Midwest

Fewer people living in the Midwest report having every cheated on their partners.

^{*}Differences between Midwest & each of the other regions are statistically significant.






Attitudes Around Divorce



Men may want to stray, but they also want to stay

Despite openness to open relationships among men, more men than women believe divorce is a sin.




...say divorce is a sin.



And just as many men as women believe in sticking it out

Even when the romance dies out, most Americans believe in staying together.




...say you shouldn't divorce just because there's no longer a spark.




For men, children and marriage go hand-inhand

More men reject divorce where there is a child; in fact more men also believe a child out of wedlock is cause for marriage



...say you should marry someone if you have a child with them.




...say married couples with children should never divorce.
